As we prepare the camp for another season, there are many projects that need to be completed. Additionally, there are many things we would like to see added to the camp: big things like cabins, and little things like scripture verses in the hallways. Add to this recruiting campers and staff, and it can seem a bit overwhelming. Recently, I was reminded of Nehemiah's rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem. This was a huge task, and there were many people who didn't want the wall rebuilt. Nehemiah had the people focus on the part of the wall in front of their house. "The next repairs were made by the priests from the surrounding region. After them, Benjamin and Hasshub repaired the section across from their house, and Azariah, son of Maaseiah and grandson of Ananiah, repaired the section across from his house... Above the Horse Gate, the priests repaired the wall. Each one repaired the section immediately across from his own house." (Nehemiah 3:22-23,28)

I ask you to focus on the part of the camp that is metaphorically 'in front of your house.' It could be part of the physical grounds that you use, and how you can make it better. It could also be encouraging the neighbor kids, or financially supporting that boy from church, or that girl you know that needs to feel the love of Jesus, so

Let the Little Children Come to Me, and Do Not Hinder Them...

In January we hosted our annual Elementary Retreat. This year we had 37 campers and 21 volunteers involved; our message was on prayer. Most knew to pray for their meals and for family, but we went deeper and expanded on the for Who, for What, Why and Where



of prayers. Sharing with the children the importance of having a conversation with God at any time and in any place, because God doesn't sleep and is always ready to listen. We had them open the Bible and turn to examples of people praying and reasons they were praying: The church prayed for Peter while he was in prison (Acts 12:5), Paul requests prayer from the church in Ephesus (Ephesians 6:18), Jacob prayed for protection from his brother (Genesis 32:9-12). Hannah prayed in her anguish and then in her delight (1 Samuel 1:10-11 and 1 Samuel 2:1), Solomon prayed for discernment in his young age as king (1 Kings 3:7-9), Elijah prayed for answers (1 Kings 18:36-37), Jonah prayed from inside the big fish (Jonah 2:1-2), Daniel praised and thanked God (Daniel 2:19-23), Jesus went out to the mountain to pray before choosing His apostles (Luke 6:12-13), Jesus prayed in the garden to His Father that His will be done (Matt 26:39-44), and Jesus taught His disciples to

pray (Matt 6:9-13).

We ended the retreat with reading their Cabin prayers that the campers put together with their counselors and having them write a prayer of their own. The result was a beautiful time of prayer for each other, for those that were sick, homeless, lonely, hungry, for families and friends and thanksgiving for home and food. One prayer card left behind read:

"Dear God.

We thank you for family, and life, and animals, and everybody, and food and all of us church kids say amen.

Prayer is such an important part of our walk with God as Christians. Today I ask that you join us in praying for our ministries, our staff,



our volunteers, and the children we are connecting with "for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Luke 18:16


